CREATE activities for early career researchers in 2025

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Abstract

This article outlines the 2025 activities of Collaborative Research And Training in the EHPS (CREATE), a network run by and for Early Career Researchers (ECRs) in health psychology. CREATE offers year-round opportunities for learning, networking, and professional development, including a pre-conference workshop, 'Meet the Expert' sessions, and Early Career Spotlight talks at the EHPS 2025 conference in Groningen. Additional webinars, funding opportunities, and a new CREATEr mode initiative support ECRs in building skills, connections, and confidence at the start of their careers. This overview highlights how CREATE fosters an inclusive, engaging community for emerging researchers.

CREATE pre-conference workshop




Fig. 2. Flyer for the CREATE pre-conference workshop in 2025.

Led by experts in health psychology, these workshops offer valuable opportunities to expand knowledge and skills. They also provide a great chance to connect with peers, making networking a key aspect of the experience. In addition to engaging sessions, the workshop includes a CREATE dinner, a city tour, and various social activities.
